Start getting ready to have a safer riding season. The days are already getting longer!





You know, I can't believe I just had to write 2024 on the top of this report. Where did 2023 go? I'll be screwing up the date on checks for at least 30 days (for those of you old enough you still write checks.) We are half way through the 135th Ohio Legislature and we have a bunch of work to finish.

2024 will be a crucial year for ABATE of Ohio. Since 1978 we've fought helmet laws, closed an insurance loop hole that could leave you without coverage, helped establish and defended to Motorcycle Ohio Program and its funding, gotten license plates expanded to include motorcycle, had limitations on how you can modify your motorcycle changed and many other things as your watchdog in Columbus. And we have a big fight going on currently over the internal combustion engine.

Ohio House Bill 201 would revise the Ohio Revised Code to prohibit a state agency, county or township from restricting the sale of vehicles based on California's exemption to section 209(b) of the federal Clean Air Act. This bill has passed out of the Ohio House. ABATE of Ohio will be heading down tomorrow for Proponent testimony in the Ohio Senate Energy and Resources Committee. Hopefully by the time you read this is will have passed out of committee and passed off the Senate Floor.

Ohio Houe Resolution 198 and Ohio Senate Resolution 155 do the same thing. They both support consumer choice in the marketplace by urging the administration to insure that all regulations regarding light, medium or heavy duty vehicles promote choice and prevent electric vehicle mandates. ABATE of Ohio presented proponent testimony for HR198 and it has passed out of committee. ABATE is ready to be there in support of SR155 when testimony is heard in committee on the Senate side.

Keep an eye out for an email or call to action when the time is right on these issues. To be clear, we are not opposed to electric motorcycles. It's about the choice.

We are also supporting the MRF and NCOM's efforts with \$2090 the "Preserving Choice in Vehicle Purchases Act." There is a call to action on the MRFs website to notify the Ohio Federal Senators our support of this legislation. It's companion on the House Side HR 1435 has already passed. HR 4468 and \$3094 the "Choice in Automobile Retail Sales Act of 2023" (CARS Act for short) will reinforce these efforts. Again, be ready for action when the time comes.



Over the years we've had of conversation over the difference between "Talk"ers and "Do"ers. Every one of us can stop at the local tavern and run into "Talk"ers. Social media is another good place for them to hang out. Most of us have to deal with them in both our personal and professional lives. They are big on the mouth but somewhat vacant when it comes time to get the work done.

Maybe that's why we are such a successful grass roots organization. We give the "Do"ers and place to go and be with other "Do"ers. Less than 3% of the population belong to an organization the defends their rights. Any kind of rights. That's where the term 3% er originated.

Let's be the "Do"ers and give our children and grand children the opportunity to enjoy the same freedom we enjoy (and maybe get a little back). Happy New Year, now let's get to work. We have one more year of this Legislature to get things passed.

Like the joy of expectation for the holidays, many riders wait with anticipation for the opening of the <u>Motorcycle Ohio (MO) training portal</u> each year. Are you or do you have a friend who wants to try out motorcycle riding for the first time; or perhaps a friend who has been riding for years but is not endorsed? Send them to the portal to sign up.It's not just for new/beginning riders to get their endorsement either. For example, each year for the past 5 years, one of my students has come back every spring to refresh himself by taking the Basic Rider Skills for Returning Riders course (BRS-RR). He feels that his skills grow rusty over the winter and can improved by taking this class which sets him up for a successful and more safe riding year. This year the portal will open on *January 24, 2024 at 8:00 am*. Where else can you actively engage in dreaming about next year's riding? Right Here!Mark you calendars.

Where is MO Public Training offered in Ohio? The counties shown below all offer the Basic Rider Skills (BRS) course. Fewer counties offer the Basic Rider Skills for Returning Riders (BRS-RR) and the Basic Riders Skills 2 (BRS-2) course, so you'll need to confirm your local sites specific class availability if you want to take one of the more advanced classes.



Pro Tip: It's recommended that you sign up well in advance for your class. However, if you go to sign up for a class and it is already listed as full but you still want to attempt to attend that specific session, there is a MO Stand-by Policy. In brief, it provides the ability to potentially join a class, if there are "no-shows". There are a number of conditions so it's important that you understand them before attempting to "walk-in". Please see the MO website for policy details. See you on the range in 2024!
















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Happy New Year to all my Abate of Ohio members and my MRF Members.

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation would like to thank these six bikers for volunteering their time on this project:

The primary focus of their work will be updating three documents: The National Agenda for Motorcycle Safety (NAMS), Model National Standards for Entry-Level Motorcycle Rider Training (Content Standards), and Model National Administrative Standards for State Motorcycle Rider Training Programs (Administrative Standards).

Between January and September 2024, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) will hold monthly meetings with diverse stakeholders to update and modernize these key motorcycle policy documents. All motorcyclists are extremely fortunate that these six individuals will be able to share their extensive knowledge, experience and passion on issues that matter to all bikers.

We know that some state motorcyclist rights groups also have participants in the "Community of Practice" project and we applaud their involvement. Without a doubt, the work of these NHTSA-sponsored groups will be better because of their involvement.

We look forward to hearing more about their work in 2024!

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2024 Honda Gold Wing Tour Airbag DCT

As we know, the luxury tourer was almost completely redesigned for

the 2018 model year, dropping a pile of weight and getting a double wishbone front suspension as well as a reworked flat six-cylinder engine. The changes instantly broadened its appeal, and further improvements to suspension, electronics, audio and rider conveniences in subsequent years helped evolve the big Wing further. All of which is to say that for 2024, the venerable Wing is essentially unchanged, but you're still getting a feature-packed spec sheet, with a seven-speed <u>DCT transmis-</u>

sion, a 7-inch TFT screen, navigation, Apple Car-Play, Android Auto, an adjustable electric windscreen, Smart Key operation, four riding modes, traction control, Hill Start, and more. The Gold Wing Tour variant adds a rear luggage box with integrated backrest and even more comfort features.

For 2024 the big Wing is returning in top-of-theline Gold Wing Tour Air-



bag DCT form, with a \$33,000 MSRP and will be available in Pearl White. The Gold Wing Tour in both DCT and manual forms is back as well, in Gray Metallic/ Black or Pearl White options for \$29,700 and \$28,700, respectively.

The base-model Gold Wing and Gold Wing DCT, however, do feature a new color for 2024; both are available in Matte Armored Green Metallic, with brown detailing on the engine cases. The base Wing rings in at \$24,700, and the DCT version at \$25,700.

LEGISLATIVE NEWS



As I write this it is early December and so far the winter has not turned terrible yet. If you are still out riding be careful. Vehicle drivers aren't looking for us in the summer months, so they sure aren't looking for us now.

After a lot of work, I have finally finished my proposal to modify the Ohio revised code to protect vulnerable road users from right of way violators. I have presented my proposal to the state board of directors and after they have time to review it, I will begin to send it out to various politicians to hopefully find someone to sponsor to make it become a bill. When this happens, it will be up to everyone to make phone calls to make it happen. Simply put, this proposal will make it a felony to violate someone's right of way if doing so causes death or serious injury. It will also mandate loss of driving privileges and require a remedial driving course to get those privileges back.

I have not had a chance to follow up on the progress of getting an anti-profiling bill introduced so stay tuned for more information on this issue after the first of the year.

Check out Ed Schetter's article to learn more about all the state and federal efforts to preserve the Internal Combustion Engine. One day this country and the world will be making and selling modes of transportation that are powered by natural and renewable energies. This is a good thing because we shouldn't use up all of Earth's finite resources. But it must be done in a system that fully supports the smooth transaction into the new system.

Enjoy your transition into a new year, but remember that if we don't fight to maintain our rights to ride, no one else will. Make a renewed dedication to yourself to do what ever you can to maintain the right to live and ride freely like you should be able to do in a free country!!! Remember..... FREEDOM IS NEVER FREE!

ANOTHER REASON TO INCREASE YOUR COVERAGE TO AT LEAST 250/500

The odd choice of 100,000 per person/300,000 per accident uninsured and underinsured coverage on a motorcycle

That is, unless you have a sidecar. If you're paying for 100,000 per person/300,000 per accident un/underinsured coverage on your motorcy-

cle (a two-person vehicle) then you're paying for potential coverage for a third person that will never be there. Now, it is better to have 100/300 than even lower limits such as 25,000/50,000, but hopefully this pushes you to up your limit to 250,000 per person/500,000 per accident to better cover yourself in case an uninsured driver turns left in front of you. And at least you'll know you're not paying for coverage for a third person who is not legally allowed to ride on your motorcycle (again, unless you have a sidecar).

MARVELS OF MARVEL MYSTERY OIL - A SECRET MUST FOR MOTORCYCLE WINTER STORAGE

When it gets so cold out you know you will not be riding for a few weeks, stop by an auto parts store or a Walmart and get a quart can of Marvel Mystery Oil. Pour almost the whole can in the gas tank (save about 4-6 tablespoons for later), and then fill the tank up completely with fuel. The Marvel Mystery Oil will act as an upper cylinder lubricant. (This stuff has been around since the 30s, and I still don't know how it works. Air cooled airplane engines love the stuff. And we all know that the airplane guys got the idea for aircraft engines from us motorcycle guys. If you want to unstick some valves or lubricate sticking valves, this stuff works like magic. Paul Romine, the guy who remanufactured Ford engines for Ford in the midwest and a NHRA Champion, swears by the stuff, and that's enough for me. -Rod)

Remember that 4-6 tablespoons of Marvel Mystery Oil we held in reserve? Now comes the time to use it. Pull the spark plugs out of the engine, pour a tablespoon of Marvel Mystery Oil in each cylinder, and turn the engine over by hand several revolutions in order to spread the Marvel Mystery Oil around the cylinder walls. Reinstall the spark plugs. Simple steps like these will keep your bike ready for this spring and many more to come! Especially if you own a shovel.

GRANDDAD'S HARLEY DAVIDSON WLA - IS IT COVERED?

Q. You are restoring your grandfather's WLA. It is not plated/licensed because you have taken it all apart in your garage and have restored it like new. Grand-dad would be proud. But before you plate/license the bike, your garage catches fire and destroys your family heritage. You call your insurance company and make a claim for your loss under the fire policy for your home/ garage. They pay for the garage fire loss and all of the personal property, but deny your claim for the motorcycle. How can this be?

A. Most homeowners/fire insurance policies have an exclusion for "unlicensed" motorcycles/ automobiles. So if you want your restoration project covered you must call your insurance company and request that the "project" be specifically scheduled on your homeowners insurance policy. The charge is usually modest. Failure to get this bike scheduled will leave you without insurance on your bike if it is destroyed by fire. Interestingly, if the motorcycle has been totally disassembled into parts, a good argument could be made that under most homeowner policies, the parts would have been covered. But as to a completed bike, not so. A long time ABATE member from Springfield, Illinois discovered this the hard way. "Digger" was restoring his vintage bike when his garage caught fire and destroyed his prized possession. His insurance carrier took a hard line and denied coverage for his bike. Moral of the story: call your insurance company and ask them whether the unlicensed bike is covered. If they say yes- send a confirming email/letter. If they say no, acknowledge to yourself that you are going bare (no coverage) or get the bike scheduled on your policy for the proper value.

DROP MY NAME

THE DEFINITION OF "BIKER" HAS EVOLVED

Q: People say I'm a biker. What's a biker? ABATE member.

A: Depends on your attitude, I suppose. The word "biker," like many others, has meaning and usage, some of which are positive, and some of which are not. Not even dictionaries can agree on the definition. Webster's Third New International Dictionary defines a biker as "motorcyclist; especially one who is a member of an organized gang." (A member of a gang? What is with that?) The American Heritage Dictionary of the English Language notes a biker is "1. One who rides a bicycle or a motorbike. 2. A motorcyclist, especially a member of a motorcycle gang." Meanwhile, our British cousins define a biker as "someone who rides a motorcycle or bicycle," - Cambridge Dictionary of American English. Curiously, the Cambridge International Dictionary of English notes an informal usage of biker as "a member of a gang group of motorcyclists." The Random House Historical Dictionary of American Slang notes that the meaning of "biker" as "gang member" became current usage in 1968. Of course, the term would have been used informally for some time before that. Prior to 1981, Webster's had no definition for biker at all, and was added in order to better reflect current trends in popular usage, according to a spokesperson for Webster's.

How did we get from "motorcycle rider" to "gang member?" The exact route is unclear, but three events seem to have solidified the "gang member" connotation for bikers. The first is the Hollister, CA rally of 1947. Shortly after the end of WWII, large numbers of demobilized troops turned to motorcycling for recreation, camaraderie, and as a way of dealing with the lingering horrors of war (Today, it is called post traumatic stress syndrome by some). One of the gatherings of riders that caught the attention of the press was a rally held in Hollister, California, about 100 miles south of San Francisco. Life Magazine, in an effort to portray the spirit of motorcycling, staged a picture of a man sitting on top of a motorcycle amid a pile of beer bottles. The myth of the biker was born.



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Two other events brought the myth into clear focus for the masses, and both were images from the movies. The 1954 release of Brando's "The Wild One" and 1969's "Easy Rider" cemented an image of bikers as marauding, out-of-control gang members. Subsequent movies and books have relied on those associations to the point where the mental image of "biker" becomes Brando or Dennis Hopper (with a football helmet, no less). It's a shame that a conscientious, hard-working, freedom-loving group of individualists are defined by media image and a some that are not us.

How do we change the image? We keep doing the things we always do: respect others, defend our rights, participate in our communities, help the less fortunate, and ride safely. But we can do more, like contacting publishers of dictionaries and letting them know that bikers aren't gang members any more than any other group. ABATE Legal has taken the lead by writing to the publishers of Webster's and other dictionaries to ask that they make modifications to the definition to clarify the usage.

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


Once again thank you board members and members that has been a part of this over the last 12 or 13 years and let's keep it going as the great team that we are.






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The MRF's primary goals include:
