





IIHS Updates Crash Ratings

The Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS) announced updated ratings for vehicle-to-vehicle front crash prevention tests to address crashes that occur at higher speeds and those in which the struck vehicle is a motorcycle or large truck. This is the first time the IIHS has done this type of test involving motorcycles. The IIHS is an independent, nonprofit scientific and educational organization

dedicated to reducing deaths, injuries, and property damage from motor vehicle crashes through research and evaluation and by educating consumers, policy-makers, and safety professionals.

The trials involving motorcycles positioned the bike in the center of the lane and offset to the left and the right. Tested vehicles were evaluated on forward collision warning and automatic emergency braking (AEB) systems. In each test run, an engineer drives the test vehicle toward the target at the selected speed and records when the forward collision warning occurs and how much the AEB system slows the vehicle to prevent or mitigate the impending impact. Tests are conducted at three different speeds, 31mph, 37mph and 43mph.

Of the ten (10) vehicles tested in the "Small SUV" category just one, the Subaru Forester, received a "good rating." It achieved this rating by avoiding a crash with the motorcycle at the two lower speeds and slowing from 43 mph to 13 mph before making contact with the bike.

Unfortunately, four of the vehicles tested into the bottom "poor rating." The Chevy Equinox for example, which was rated poor, "Failed to give a warning, or gave it too late in most tests with the motorcycle target." To make matters worse its AEB was ineffective, causing the IIHS to state "With the motorcycle target it barely reduced speed at all."

IIHS Senior Research Scientist David Kidd, who led the development of the new evaluation, pointed out why these new tests are so important, "Motorcyclists are frequently killed when they're rear-ended by a passenger car since their bike offers no protection from the impact."

Last December, the IIHS estimated that if the front crash prevention technology worked as well detecting motorcycles as it does for cars and light-duty trucks, 500 fewer rear-end crashes involving motorcyclists would occur annually.

However, challenges remain, as Dr. Kidd stated, "Motorcycles are smaller and narrower than cars, making them more difficult for camera and radar-based systems to identify, especially at higher speeds." The Motorcycle Riders Foundation thanks the IIHS for beginning to include motorcycles in this testing regimen. We hope these ratings and further tests help educate consumers about what their vehicles can and cannot do, as well as motivate manufacturers to build technology that protects everyone on the road equally.



Well, the summer is starting. Be careful out there, because there has already been way too many accidents, and deaths! Cagers not paying attention, weather conditions and motorcyclists poor choices appear to be on track for a record setting year. Your family, your friends and your ABATE organization need you to hang around here for a while more.

To support our right to have unhindered access to public roads I am continuing to work on the Right of Way (ROW) bill. Representative Brian Lorenz has been championing this bill proposal. I was presented with an initial draft that was drawn up by the Legislative Service Commission. It was not even close to what I had drafted, and I told Representative Lorenz that I could not support this draft in any way. I was just provided a copy of the second draft, and I glanced through it but have not had time to really review it. My initial look at it does not look good for this draft either.

This is a process but at least it has started.

Once we get a ROW bill introduced, we will start pushing a proposal that is already written regarding our desire for an anti-profiling bill.

In other news, Rep. Jon Cross (R-Findlay) has proposed a bill that would make not wearing a seat belt a primary offense.

Ohio's seat belt usage dropped to 80.8% in 2022, its lowest level in 18 years, according to an annual observational survey by the Department of Public Safety's Ohio Traffic Safety Office. Ohio is one of 15 states that has a secondary seat belt law.

Cross stated, "We say that the law is a teacher and strict enforcement is one of the keys in changing drivers' behavior," pointing to the state's new distracted driving law. He said "Since that law took effect about a year ago, distracted driving in Ohio is down 8.6%. That's prevented 3,600 crashes, 2,000 injuries and 17 deaths just in that short period of time."

Cross notes that violations involving taillights, headlights or mirrors are primary offenses in Ohio.

House Speaker Jason Stephens (R-Kitts Hill) and Senate President Matt Huffman (R-Lima) haven't embraced the idea of a primary seat belt law.

Ride save, watch out for those who aren't!

Hello Abate Friends!!!

As I write this article a dear friend is in ICU due to a motorcycle accident. No one pulled in front of her, no animal ran into her path, something just happened. This woman has many more miles under her belt than I will ever have but it shows you that shit happens. It can happen to any one of us at any time, when we are least expecting it. So how do we prevent it, well there is no perfect answer. All the training in the world can sometimes not make a difference. With that being said, I STILL encourage you all to practice all the time no matter how long you've been riding. When you leave or are coming home, swing into a parking lot and do figure 8's, swerves and quick stop braking. You always need more skills in one bucket than risk in the other!

Remember you can contact my friend Mike Wiesenbach with ProRider Columbus (814-322-5265) to take an advanced course. You need to be intimate with your own motorcycle. You need to know how she will react at anytime. Stay Safe my friends!!!

We still have the Organizational License Plate petition out there in your regions! REGION DIRECTORS – I have not heard anything from any of you. We need to keep this moving!!!

May was Motorcycle Awareness Month and that means we are on the roads. We need to stay vigilant! Use the following as a guide as you ride:

SIPDE

SCANNING: aggressive purposeful search.

INDENTIFY: hazards in your immediate path PREDICT: WHAT IF? WHAT WILL THEY DO?

DECIDE: What will you do?

EXECUTE: Act on what you decided

All the above must be done in a very quick amount of time. Keep your head and eyes always moving. This will help you see hazards early and give you the most time to execute your plan!

REMEMBER: AMA Vintage Days July 26th thru 28th. I will be working on a Volunteer sign up sheet, so make sure you keep those days open if you want to volunteer. Those volunteers will get that day's entry free of charge. I would like to have different volunteers each day as we will have the Abate of Ohio booth and the MRF Booth on sight.

They do have camping available, but I do not know currently if you volunteer for a day you get to camp for free all weekend. I will let you know all the specifics soon.

Do you See me Now? Vision Training

When a Basic Rider Skills course is taken, the instructor may instruct the students to look in front, to the side, and behind every time before they start moving. These directions are a starting point in using your vision. Vision is one of the most important "Tools" in a rider's toolbox. Interestingly enough, vision is not static and we have different vision functions. Some of the types and an example of a use of it are:.

Central - Our central vision is only about 3°. Unless we look at something directly, we can't see details. To understand this type of vision, try reading the numbers on a speedometer while still focusing on the car ahead. If your focus point is not using the central vision range, you simply can't read the numbers or hashes between them. Adjusting your vision to capture risks is necessary.

Accommodation – The ability to move the focus from near to far. Watching the vehicle right in front of us stop at a light and then shifting focus to a traffic signal to confirm when it changes color allows one to prepare to get underway. This is better than simply relying on the movement of the vehicle directly ahead as a method to start out. This method means we'll potentially have a delay versus using both the traffic light and vehicles around us.

Depth Perception – The ability to assess the distance to a target or object. Used when estimating braking force required when stopping behind another vehicle.


Dynamic Visual Acuity – The ability to see, interpret and react immediately to a rapidly moving object. Used by a rider to assess whether the vehicle coming the other way is likely to cross into the path of travel being followed.

Some of the different types of vision can be enhanced by doing simple exercises. How impactful would it be if you were able to avoid an incident because of practicing and improving your visual skills?

- 1) One common exercise involves focusing on a near object and then *quickly shifting focus* to a distant one; repeating this process will improve the speed of accommodation.
- 2) Another technique may involve tracking moving objects to enhance convergence and divergence abilities.
- 3) You blink less when you're focused on riding and that is compounded by the air drying your eyes. Practice taking opportunities to *intentionally blink frequently* as you move your head from side to side when scanning.
- 4) To improve depth perception, practice this as you relax after your ride. Roll your eyes around your line of sight. Keep your head stationary and move your eyes deliberately. Focus on items within your vision as you do this. Doing this regularly can help you see noticeable depth perception improvements with time.




